5. Business Arising

- **5.1** J Webb met with Essan Dileri, Melton City Council's Intercultural Development Officer, to discuss some ideas on promoting the road safety forums to CALD groups and ensure that the promotional wording is inclusive.
- 5.2 J Webb has contacted Phillip Schwalger, CALD representative. Jan will send Phillip the Community Road Safety Forum (CRSF) flyer. J Webb noted that she is attending and supporting a Road Safety Forum at Lakeview College Road on 21 September 2017 that has been organised by Victoria Police. Jan will seek interest from other schools in the City of Melton to host a similar session.
- 5.3 CRSF Survey feedback has been noted and considered by K Ramazanoglu and J Webb.
- **5.4** M Nunn and J Webb have met to discuss the results of the Lifestyle and Community survey that was conducted by Lendlease for the Atherstone community.
- **5.5** J Webb and M Ensink met with Council's Traffic Team and Local Laws to discuss the matter of road safety around schools.
- 5.6 T Lay and Police members to meet at the Youth Services centre site with M Goodie and O Ramos, to discuss the car park/pedestrian crossing issue. M Goodie reported that a meeting was held with Council and Woodgrove Shopping Centre to address the unsafe crossing point in Barries Road outside the Youth Centre. It was identified that this section of the road is owned by Woodgrove Shopping Centre Management. Therefore, any improvements that are undertaken will be the responsibility of Woodgrove Shopping Centre Management. Cr Ramsey noted that a list of road improvement priorities have been provided to state government.
- 5.7 T Lay was not present to discuss the concerns that were raised with VicRoads regarding pedestrians crossing the Western Freeway including some improvements that can be made to prevent access.
- 5.8 T Lay was to consider the most appropriate location to place the road safety sign. J Webb noted that the sign has been installed on Calder Park Drive, Taylors Hill.
- 5.9 Cr Ramsey was to move a motion at a future Council meeting for a memorial tree and plaque to be planted at either the Civic Centre or the Courthouse, in memory of those who have lost their lives on our roads.

Cr Ramsey reported that a motion was moved by her at the Ordinary Council meeting held 26 June 2017 and that the tree will be placed at Hannah Watts Park.

6. General Business

6.1 Community Road Safety Forum – 14 September

6.2 Aboriginal Learner Driver Education Program Launch

J Webb reported that the program was launched on 29 August with 15 community members enrolled. The program aims to assist the Aboriginal community in obtaining their licence and is being held in partnership with Kirrip House. The program includes six educational sessions followed by some professional driving lessons.

6.3 Road Safety Awareness Project for New Arrivals 2017-2018

J Webb reported that the Road Safety Awareness Program for newly arrived community members, which is currently managed by Migrant Resource Centre, will begin on 10 October 2017 and will include seven educational sessions followed by professional driving lessons for participants.

6.4 Reports

6.4.1 Youth Services

M Goodie reported that Youth Services have an increase of participants that are from the African community. Currently a worker is being recruited to support this community. Discussions have been held with Woodgrove Shopping Centre Management regarding young people and their behaviour in and around the precinct and some possible solutions on how to address this. Currently 70 to 80 young people are engaged in the Launch Pad program, a cooking program and various other programs at Youth Services.

6.4.2 Victoria Police

Sgt Stuhldreier reported a summary of annual road statistics data for 1 July 2016 to 30 June 2017. Full report was tabled at the meeting.

Sgt Stuhldreier noted that serious injury is tracking downward and the City of Melton is lower compared to the rest of Victoria. Road statistics are static, given the local area population growth this is a downward trend for the City of Melton. Hoon driving statistics are also lower. There has been an increase in the number of positive drug tests that have been undertaken in the Melton Police Service Area (PSA), with one in three tests conducted resulting positive. Sgt Stuhldreier noted that the cost to conduct drug testing is substantial in comparison to blood alcohol level testing.

Sgt Stuhldreier noted that the Melton PSA Highway Patrol unit is currently undergoing a review with some consideration to become a divisional unit that will be stationed at the Caroline Springs Police Station.

G Greaves noted that the Pink Ribbon motorcycle ride that supports the breast cancer cause will be held on the 29 October 2017 and this will begin at Rockbank with around 5,000 participants anticipated.

Cr Ramsey reported that Council is advocating with State Government regarding improvements to arterial roads in the City of Melton.
