Thank you for contacting me about Melton City Council's concern regarding recent home invasions within your municipality. I am sorry to hear that there is a feeling in the Melton community that people are not as safe as they used to be and that the police response has been inadequate.

There is no higher priority for the Victorian Government than community safety. That is why I am committed to making meaningful change to keep Victorians safe, including ensuring that Victoria Police has the resources and powers it needs.

When it comes to policing, we know that business as usual just won't cut it anymore. That is why, in partnership with Victoria Police, we have developed the Community Safety Statement 2017 (the Statement), a copy of which you'll find enclosed. Boosting police numbers across the state is a key tenet of the Statement, which outlines our plans to give police new powers and to recruit 3,135 frontline police over the next five years, over and above attrition. It is backed up by \$2 billion of new investment - the single largest investment in the history of Victoria Police, which will provide additional police and the very best crime fighting equipment.

The additional police deployed over the next five years is the biggest boost to frontline police in Victoria's history, and it is crucial to dealing with the growing demand on police services. Victoria Police has developed a sophisticated new Staff Allocation Model (SAM) to determine what and where police resources are needed, both now and into the future. Victoria Police, using the SAM, has allocated the first 300 frontline police officers from this unprecedented expansion to seven areas across Victoria and the first of these new police officers have already started to hit the streets, including more than 100 who will be based in Melbourne's western suburbs.

As outlined in the Statement, the Government will work with Victoria Police to ascertain the views, expectations and ideas of the Victorian public through the year. The outcome of this state-wide consultation will inform the development of the 2018 Community Safety Statement. I encourage you to contribute to this public consultation. Details will be published at https://engage.vic.gov.au/consultations in due course.

We have also introduced a range of tough new laws and stronger penalties to crack down on serious crimes. This includes serious carjacking and home invasions, with new laws and statutory minimum non-parole periods for these crimes.
