5.3 Heritage Week 2017

Heritage Week activities will be from 18 to 30 April in 2017.

The National Trust have advised that the heritage theme for 2017 will be 'Having a Voice', which reflects a diverse range of voices, many of which normally don't get heard.

The following activities are being planned:

- · Melton South Walking Tour with Wendy Barrie
- A Cultural Heritage Talk with the Wathaurong in Eynesbury
- Dry Stone Wall Workshop
- ANZAC Day exhibition of conscription posters
- The Melton Family History Group may be holding a workshop, details of which are yet to be confirmed.
- The Melton Historical Society may be holding an event, details of which are yet to be confirmed.
- SJP is still taking suggestions on the bus tour destination as the Gisborne Historical Society tour is proving hard to organise.

The following suggestions were made for Heritage Week 2018:

- Running a school program such as what songs were in the 'hit parade' for the year that each school in Melton opened.
- Holding an event in the refurbished High Street amphitheatre in Melton Township.



- · Holding an event in Caroline Springs.
- Use a stage set company to recreate the original township on Melton in a park.
- Investigate creating a film or photo montages on streets in Melton then and now.

5.4 Advertising for Vacant Community Member Position

5.5 Heritage Assistance Fund

No applications were received for the 2016-17 round of the Melton Heritage Assistance Fund.

SJP reported that the recipients of the Heritage Assistance Fund 2015-16 did not commence the works that they had applied for. The landowner then confirmed that they were ready to commence works and once again they failed to start the works. The extension of time has now been cancelled and the landowner notified.

SJP is working with some landowners to ensure that they are ready to submit an application when the next round of the Heritage Assistance Fund is advertised.

SJP advised given the historical low take up of the program, consideration may be given to opening the Heritage Assistance Fund to developers to carry out works on heritage places

Action

MM / SJP to report on the refresh of the Melton Heritage Assistance Fund which will allow developers to receive funding for improvements to heritage places.

6. Other Business

- AP reported that the workmanship on the Willows verandah posts are not great SJP to follow this up.
- SJP advised that the Public Records Office of Victoria have a local history grants program which supports community groups to preserve their local history and heritage.
- DP advised that the National Archives of Australia have a similar program.
- CM informed that the HAC that Mary Tolhurst has died, which is a huge loss for Melton as she was one of the founding members of the Melton and District Historical Society and was a wealth of information about the history and heritage of Melton.
- DP enquired whether Melton Council has a honour board for people's hard work in the heritage field. SJP advised that Council does not have an honour board.
- BT enquired about what Council is doing about the poor state of the former Sunday School building at the Melton Anglican Church. SJP to organise a meeting between BT and Council's Statutory Planners.

Action

SJP to investigate the workmanship on the verandah posts at the Willows

SJP to organize a meeting between BT and Council's Statutory Planners to discuss the former Sunday School building at the Melton Anglican Church.
