WHAT CAN I PUT IN EACH BIN?

Aluminium and steel, includina cans, clean aluminium foil and travs. empty aerosol cans.

- Glass, including bottles and iars (lids removed). No broken glass or mirror should be put in your recycling bin.
- Plastics and cartons. including milk and juice cartons, hard plastics that

hold their shape (like ice cream containers and detergent bottles), paper and cardboard, newspaper, magazines, envelopes, junk mail, cereal boxes, egg cartons and clean pizza boxes.

Soft plastic, however you can avoid putting plastic bags in landfill by taking them to a specialty REDcycle collection points located at Coles and Woolworths

ENVIRONMENTAL ENHANCEMENT REBATE

Owners of a property larger than two hectares (approximately five acres), may be eligible to receive a rebate on their rates (capped at \$10,000) if they meet the requirements of the Environmental Enhancement Rate Rebate Policy. Land that has an approved Planning Permit for Subdivision is ineligible and the Environmental Enhancement Rate Rebate does not apply. Any queries on the rebate should be directed to Council's Environmental Services department.

RATES: YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED

Each year Council determines the amount of rate revenue needed to deliver key services, programs, facilities, parks, and other community infrastructure.

HOW ARE MY RATES CALCULATED?

Rates are calculated on the Capital Improved Value (CIV) of your property. This means the combined value of your land and all improvements to the property. State legislation requires properties to be valued on a common date every year. All properties were valued on 1 January 2021.

WHAT ARE THE OTHER CHARGES ON MY NOTICE?

Municipal Charge - \$152 is applied to each rateable property to recover part of the administrative costs of operating Council.

Waste Management Charge - a flat rate of \$332 is payable for waste disposal. This fee covers kerbside waste collection and disposal, and

household waste entitlements.

Fire Services Property

Levy - Council is required by the State Government to collect the Fire Services Property Levy via your rates and remit the payment to the State Government. The charge is made up of two parts, a fixed charge on each property and a variable charge based on your capital improved value.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Each year, Council strives to develop a budget that delivers the quality infrastructure, programs, and services our growing community needs to thrive, and 2021/2022 is no different.



We're planning more capital projects than before, through a significant capital works investment of \$153.5 million, within the context of a low rate rise of 1.5 per cent.

Highlights include construction of Mt Atkinson East Community Hub; expansion of the Melton Recycling Facility (Stage Two); installation of traffic lights along Taylors Road at Westwood Drive, Sinclairs Road and Plumpton Road; and along Caroline Springs Boulevard at The Crossing and Rockbank Middle Road; urbanisation of Bulmans Road; construction of Boundary Road from Mt Cottrell Road to The Mall; Taylors Hill Recreation Reserve Pavilion Project; completion of Cobblebank Indoor Stadium; redevelopment of the Diggers Rest Recreation Reserve; and MacPherson Park redevelopment project (Stage 2).

We've also reviewed our waste service offerings, increasing waste entitlements for households, and implementing a flat rate for kerbside bin collections, making it easier to dispose of waste in a convenient and environmentally sustainable manner.

Again, community consultation informed Council's budget deliberations and I thank everyone who shared their ideas and visions for the City with us.

WASTE DISPOSAL OPTIONS

CHANGES TO FEE STRUCTURE FOR BIN OPTIONS

In response to State Government increases to the landfill levy, up 40 per cent, Council reviewed the waste service options and pricing structure available to households.

Waste service options have now been streamlined and from 1 July, the waste service charge became a flat fee of \$332, for all options, including an additional At Home hard waste collection and an optional kerbside green FOGO (Food Organics. Green Organics) bin in two sizes, at no additional cost.

Either property owners or residential tenants can request a change to a property's bin options, with proof of residency. Additional bins, however, can only be requested by property owners, as fees apply. To alter your bin option please visit melton.vic.gov.au/bins

KERBSIDE BIN COLLECTIONS

Household waste, green waste and recycling is managed through kerbside bin collection, with various bin sizes and combinations available to choose from.

Two hard waste collections up to 3m³ from within your property boundary.

Bookings essential. Visit melton.vic.gov.au/hardwaste

OR

Two visits to the Melton Recycling Facility with a car or trailer up to 1m³.

Access for ratepayers is available by scanning your rates notice or quoting your Rates Assessment Number. Residential tenants can access these options by applying in advance. Proof of residency is required.

OR

One visit to the Melton Recycling Facility and one At Home hard waste collection.

The Melton Recycling Facility (33 Ferris Rd, Cobblebank) is open 7 days and provides a safe, cost effective way to dispose of unwanted household items, keeping them out of landfill.
