### 4. Business Arising

The following matters are business arising from the previous meeting of the Heritage Advisory Committee held on 27 February 2020:

- The matters relating to the Heritage Festival 2020 are no longer relevant as it was cancelled due to COVID-19.
- DS raised the Jimmy Melrose memorial and it was advised by SJP that the structure of the memorial is sound but the plaque is old and needs to be replaced. The Committee was informed by SJP that the vegetation at the creek and subsequently the memorial has been maintained by Council staff prior to 27 February 2020. SJP was to contact the Scouts who arranged the original memorial, as they may like to lead the process for a new plaque. SJP has not been able to contact the Scouts due to COVID-19 and will endeavor to do so now that restrictions have eased.

#### 5. General Business

Heritage Festival 2020:

The Heritage Festival 2020 was cancelled due to COVID-19. Council are the format of the Heritage Festival 2021 in line with COVID-19 restrictions, and will advise the Committee at the next meeting. The events prepared for the 2020 Festival can be used again if there is a Festival in 2021. The Committee were encouraged to think of ideas for a potential 2021 Festival and provide them to GB via email.

 Actions from the Heritage Strategy, Theme 1: Progress report on interpretation signage at Council properties, Westwood Drive Bridge and Morton Homestead:

SJP advised the Committee that Council has commissioned a new template for heritage signage across the municipality. The design is being finalised, and when produced will be installed at the relevant heritage places including Morton Homestead and the Westwood Drive bridge.

• Amendment C198: Conservation Desirables Round 1:

GB updated the Committee on Amendment C198 which is proposing to protect 9 conservation desirable properties under the Heritage Overlay. GB noted that progress updates were sent to the Committee throughout the year via email which informed them that 9 submissions were received. GB advised the Committee that Amendment C198 to the *Melton Planning Scheme* was heard by an independent Planning Panel on 7 December 2020 and that one party was heard. The report from the Planning Panel is expected in December 2020 and will be considered at the 8 February 2021 Council Meeting.

SJP provided context of the Heritage Overlay and Conservation Desirable places and that there are three rounds of Conservation Desirables to be completed.

 Actions of the Heritage Strategy, Theme 2: Progress report on heritage review of another 16 Conservation Desirable sites (Round 2):

SJP explained to the Committee that Council officers are working with heritage consultant Lovell Chen to assess a further 16 Conservation Desirable sites to determine if they should be protected by a Heritage Overlay. It is anticipated the draft assessment will be completed in June, 2021.

Round 10 Applications to the Heritage Assistance Fund 2020:

SJP informed the Committee that there was a great deal of interest in the Heritage Assistance Fund this year with a large number of enquiries from a range of applicants, including three places which are listed on the Victorian Heritage Register, three which are publically accessible and two which are on private land. SJP explained that it was pleasing that three of the applicants were applying for funds for works which were continued from previous years. Two of the applicants were undertaking works as a result of recommendations in Conservation Management Plans which had been partially funded by the Heritage Assistance Fund in previous

Five applications were received and were found to be eligible. One applicant withdrew their application and will reapply next year.

The four applications were evaluated by a Panel of three Council Officers and recommendations made as to the amount of funds to be allocated to each application. The recommendations of the Panel were that each applicant receive the following amounts:

Application 2 - \$21,000.00

Application 5 - \$5,000.00

Application 6 - \$19,000.00

Application 7 - \$25,000.00

The Committee discussed the Panel's recommendation per the Assessment Matrix Addenda 1. The Committee unanimously carried the Panel's recommendations which was moved by DS and seconded by FS.
