#### INTRODUCTION

Gambling Harm Awareness Week (GHAW) is held each year to raise awareness of gambling harm and the importance of gambling responsibly, at an individual, gaming industry and community level. Melton City Council is pleased to partner with the Victorian Responsible Gambling Foundation in delivering locally relevant gambling fact sheets, together with local information on pokies losses. In 2014, Council adopted its Responsible Gambling Policy, highlighting its commitment to working alongside the community to raise awareness and respond to expressed needs. Council is also in the process of developing a Local Planning Policy on Electronic Gaming Machines (pokies), which will form part of the City of Melton Planning Scheme.

#### **GAMING MACHINE (POKIES) DATA**

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Losses to pokie machines in the City of Melton increased by over \$5 million or 7% in the past year.



#### **POKIES VENUES**

There are 7 pokies venues in the City of Melton.



#### **NUMBER OF EGMs**

There are 503 pokie machines. That's 61% of the Municipal Cap of 824.



#### LOSSES IN CITY OF MELTON

\$66,052,978 was lost on pokie machines in 2017-2018. That's \$187,697 lost every day.



#### **LOSSES IN VICTORIA**

City of Melton ranked 19 of 79 Local Government Areas (Council) for pokie machine losses in Victoria.



#### **LOSSES IN AUSTRALIA**

\$669 is lost per adult per year.




## 2017-2018 Gaming Losses in the North West of Melbourne





## 2016-2017 Gaming Losses in the North West of Melbourne



## **Pokies in Victoria**

Pokies losses per annum in Victoria exceeds \$2billion. That's over \$7million lost every day.

The three of the top ten highest losses are recorded in municipalities neighbouring the City of Melton.
