
Location & Growth



- Situated in one of the fastest growing regions in Australia with a population of 9,855
- > Between 2001 2011, the population has grown by more than 3,986 people (83%)
- > By 2036, the population will grow to more than 11,240 (13% increase)




Population



- > Young population, median age is 32 (City of Melton, 32)
- > 167 babies born in 2014 (City of Melton, 2,172)
- > 77% of the population is aged less than 49 years
- > The largest population age groups are:
 - 0-4 years old (872)
 - 25-29 years old (837)
 - 5-9 years old (793)
- Between 2011 and 2026, the population age structure forecasts indicate a 129% increase in population of retirement age (65+ years old)




Households



- There are more than 3,420 households
- Household composition is:
 - 42% couples with children (City of Melton, 43%)
 - 26% couples without children (City of Melton, 21%)
 - 13% one parent families (City of Melton, 13%)
 - 14% Ione persons (City of Melton, 16%)
- Average children per family is 1.9



Diversity



- > Between 2006 and 2011, the number of overseas born residents increased from 1,238 to 1,892 (+654)
- Residents from non-English speaking backgrounds increased by 499 to 1,245 (13.5% of the total population)
- Top three countries of birth: United Kingdom, New Zealand and Malta (8.1% of the total population)
- > 17% of residents speak a language other than English (City of Melton, 29%)
- Top three religious affiliations are: Catholic, Anglican and Uniting Church
- > 23% have no religious affiliation (City of Melton, 17%)
- In Kurunjang, 80 people identify as being of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander background*




Kurunjang









- 24% of the population attend an educational institution (City of Melton, 24%)
- > There are 899 primary schoolers and 654 secondary schoolers
- 36% of residents held an educational qualification (City of Melton, 41%)
- 37% of residents have completed Year 12 (City of Melton, 46.5%)
- University attendance is 2.3% (City of Melton, 2.8%)
- Bachelor or Higher Degree qualification is 7% (City of Melton, 13.5%)
- Vocational qualification is 23% (City of Melton 20%)



Employment


Occupation of employment, 2011



- 4,266 people are employed, of which 67% are working full time and 30% part time
- Most work in technical, trade, clerical and administrative occupations
- > 10% work in professional occupations (City of Melton, 14%)
- > 76% travel to work by car (City of Melton, 75%)
- > 7% travel to work by train or bus (City of Melton, 8%)
- > 10% of residents are engaged in some form of voluntary work



Income



- > 14% of households earn low income (City of Melton, 15%)
- > 12% of households earn high income (City of Melton, 14.5%)
- Median weekly household income is \$1,290 (City of Melton, \$1,363)
- Median monthly mortgage repayments is \$1,593 (City of Melton, \$1,733)
- 8.1% of households are experiencing mortgage stress (City of Melton, 18%)
- > SEIFA index is 972 (City of Melton 1002)#
- > Average motor vehicle per dwelling is 2 (City of Melton, 1.9)
