The City of Melton is a 'young' city in terms of the average age of its population. The 'youthfulness' of the City's people raises many challenges and opportunities for education, engagement and service delivery.


- > The current population of 12 to 24 years old is 22,442 or 17.5% of the total population (Victoria, 15.5%)
- > Between 2001 2011, the 12-24 years old population has grown by more than 8,387 people
- > By 2036, the 12-24 years old will grow to more than 53,704 (or 17%) and continues to be higher than the Victorian average



- In the Eastern Corridor* there are 11,418 young people aged 12 to 24 years old (16.8%)
- > In Melton Township there are 9,809 young people aged 12 to 24 years old (19.1%)
- > In 2036, there will be more young people in the Melton Township (21,610 or 18%) than in the Eastern Corridor (17,048 or 17%)
- > Currently, the largest number of 12-24 years old reside in:
 - Caroline Springs (3,813 or 15.9%)
 - Melton West (3,224 or 20%)
 - Hillside (3,058 or 18.9%)
 - Taylors Hill (2,334 or 15.9%)



- > 14% of 15-24 years old were born overseas
- > The young people aged 15-24 years come from 45 countries
- > The top five countries of birth are:
 - Philippines (339)
 - New Zealand (335)
 - India (241)
 - Sudan (97)
 - Vietnam (99)
- > There are 179 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander^ people living in the City of Melton (or 99 males and 80 females)



- In the City of Melton, 18.3% of young people aged 20-24 years old were early school leavers, a much higher proportion than the Victorian average of 12%
- > Also more males aged 20-24 years than females left school early (22.5% and 14.0% respectively)
- > Compared to Victorian average:
 - 22.5% of 20-24 years old males left school early (Victoria 14.8%)
 - 14.0% of 20-24 year old females left school early (Victoria 9.0%)



Young People City of Melton Community Profile 2016–17




- > In the City of Melton, more people were studying at TAFE level (23.9%) compared to Greater Melbourne (16%)^^
- Participation rates of 20-24 years old in University was almost half (15.5%) compared to Victorian measure (29.2%) and ranks 38th in the State
- > A higher proportion of Year 12 or equivalent completers were looking for work in the City of Melton (6.6%), compared to Victoria (5.1%)

Youth Disengagement



- > 8.5% of 15-19 years old are not in paid work or engaged in education
 - 9.1% of males
 - 8% of females
- > 16.8% of 20-24 years old are not in paid work or engaged in education
 - 13% of males
 - 20% of females

Employment & Unemployment



- > The employment rate was higher for the 20-24 year olds (72%) than the 15-19 year olds (37.2%)
- > There were 1,197 unemployed young people in the City of Melton
- > The unemployment rate is higher for:
 - 15-19 year olds (20%)
 - 20-24 year olds (10%)
- > The number of unemployed young people in the City of Melton is higher than in Greater Melbourne
- > The youth unemployment rate is higher in the Melton Township than in the Eastern Corridor

Health & Wellbeing Indicators



In the City of Melton, the young people experienced the following:

- A higher proportion (45%) of adolescents without positive psychological development (Victoria, 28%)
- The fourth highest in the State who drank alcohol in the past thirty days
- > The fifth highest in the State who do not have someone to turn to for advice when they have problems
- A large proportion of both males (25.5%) and females (22.2%) who are current smokers compared to Victorian measure (21.4% and 16.9%, respectively)
