

Location & Growth

- > Situated in the fastest growing region in Australia with a population of 56,838
- > By 2031, the population will more than double to 120,000 (105% increase)
- Growing rapidly at 5.1% per year (or 2,658 residents) almost three times that of Greater Melbourne and Australia
- > Population has increased by almost 14,000 in the last 10 years

Approximately, 19 families per week move

17 babies are born a week (873 births in 2013)







- Average children per family 1.9


- Between 2006–2011, the number of overseas born residents increased from 6,407 to 9,393 (+2,986) which represents 20% of the total population
- People from non-English speaking backgrounds increased by 2,306 to 5,916 (12.8% of the total population)
- Top five non-English speaking countries of birth: Malta, India, the Philippines, Sudan and Italy (4.5% of the total population)
- > Catholic faith is the dominant religion, but Buddhism and Islam have almost doubled in numbers since 2006
- Higher proportion of no religious affiliation (23%) compared to City of Melton (17%)
- 491 Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander* people live in Melton Township (City of Melton, 787)








Education



- 22% of the population attend an educational institution (City of Melton, 24%)
- There are 3,979 primary schoolers and 3,010 secondary schoolers
- 36% of people have completed Year 12 (City of Melton, 46%)
- > University attendance is 2% (City of Melton, 3%)
- 7% have a Bachelor or Higher Degree qualification (City of Melton, 13.5%)
- > 22% have a vocational qualification (City of Melton, 20%)

- > 20,539 people are employed, of which 66% are working full time and 31% part time (similar pattern to the City of Melton)
- > Most work in trade and clerical occupations
- 10% work in professional occupations (City of Melton, 14%, Greater Melbourne, 24%)
- > 74.5% travel to work by car (City of Melton, 75%)
- > 8% travelled by train to work (City of Melton, 8%)
- > 11% of residents are involved in voluntary work
- More households earn low income 20% (City of Melton, 15%)
- Less households earn high income 10% (City of Melton, 14.5%)
- Median weekly household income is \$1,139 (City of Melton, \$1,363)
- Median monthly mortgage repayment \$1,517 (City of Melton, \$1,733)
- 13% of the households are experiencing mortgage stress (City of Melton, 18%)
- SEIFA index is 953 (City of Melton, 1002)*
