# **Project Updates**



MacPherson Park Recreation Reserve is one of the most iconic sports and recreation facilities within the City of Melton; a place countless sports and recreation groups have called home since the reserve was established in the 1970s.

Over the past three years, Council has been updating, transforming and reimagining MacPherson Park into some of the most modern, well appointed facilities our community has to offer, transforming this reserve into a true sports destination—not only within our community, but across Melbourne's western region and beyond.

#### **Grass oval**



Great news! Construction of the new grass oval at the MacPherson Park Recreation Reserve was completed earlier this year.

Local contractors McMahons Pty Ltd were engaged to construct the new grass oval, entry road and sports field lighting. Bewired, another local contractor, was engaged to install

the sports field lighting for this exciting project.

For the past five months, the grass has been establishing, in preparation for the 2021/2022 sports season. The local cricket club has started the preparation of the turf wicket, allowing for cricket competition to commence this month.

When it's ready for competition, the new oval will support the growing junior and senior, men's and women's participation in cricket and Australian Rules Football by replacing the old oval which had poor drainage, lighting, and playing surface, with a fantastic new, full-sized surface on which home teams and visitors can play.

#### **Soccer pavilion**



Due to be completed in January, the construction of the soccer pavilion at MacPherson Park will support the growing demand for local junior and senior, men's and women's participation in soccer.

The old pavilion, which has been demolished, was over thirty years old, in poor condition, and was not large enough to support the three soccer pitches house at the reserve.

#### **PROJECT VALUE:** \$3.9 million

Council was supported by a \$1.18 million grant from the Victorian Government through their Community Sports Infrastructure Stimulus Program for this project.

## Council adopts key strategic documents

Our new *Council and Wellbeing Plan 2021-2025, Financial Plan 2021-2031* and *Asset Plan 2021-2031,* have been adopted, following an extensive community engagement process, including the establishment of our first community panel.

The Council and Wellbeing Plan 2021-2025 sets out Council's strategic directions for the next four years and includes a new vision, which aspires to create a vibrant, safe, and liveable City accessible to all. Six themes have also been developed to address the different aspects of Council's service delivery over the next four years. These cover social and cultural connectivity, the natural and built environment, planning for current and future growth, promoting greater education and employment opportunities within the City of Melton, community engagement, and continuing Council's work as high performing organisation that demonstrates civic leadership and organisational excellence.

# **Roadworks projects**



#### **ROAD RECONSTRUCTION:**

Exford Road (between Eynesbury Road and Werribee River Bridge, Exford)

Great news for Exford and Eynesbury residents–Exford Road, between Eynesbury Road and the bridge at the Werribee River, will undergo road reconstructions as part of our Road Sealing program.

The works will rebuild this section of Exford Road to provide a new, safe road surface and includes additional safety improvements like new safety barriers, new line marking (including audio-tactile lane edge lines), improved road shoulder treatment and increased lane widths at road curves.

Tree protection zones and native vegetation "no-go" zones will be implemented during the works to ensure surrounding vegetation is protected for the duration of the works.

Council will seek to minimise traffic disruptions as much as possible during construction, but to help with traffic management, please use an alternative route, whenever possible.

**CONSTRUCTION DATES:** October to December 2021 **PROJECT VALUE:** \$994,500

#### **ROAD RECONSTRUCTION:**

#### Highfield Way and Parkleigh Drive, Kurunjang

Highfield Way and Parkleigh Drive, between Highfield Way and Herbal Avenue, Kurunjang, will undergo road and kerb reconstruction works as part of Council's 2021/2022 Road Sealing program.

The works will include rebuilding the road to remove undulations, along with some speed calming measures to increase safety for residents. The works will also include the replacement of existing driveway crossovers to properties, so residents can expect some disruption and inconvenience while these works are underway, however works will be staged and scheduled to minimise disruption as much as possible.

**CONSTRUCTION DATES:** October to December 2021 **PROJECT VALUE:** \$673,300

#### **ROAD RECONSTRUCTION:** Meskos Road, Truganina

Mesko Road, Truganina, will undergo road reconstruction to improve the surface of the road, as part of our 2021/2022 Road Sealing program.

Works will be staged and scheduled to minimise disruption to traffic as much as possible, access to residences and businesses located in Meskos Road will be maintained during the works however some delays can be expected.

**CONSTRUCTION DATES:** November to December 2021 **PROJECT VALUE:** \$405,000

#### Make the most of your waste entitlements

Council has streamlined its waste service options and introduced a flat fee of \$332. The fee includes an additional At Home hard waste collection and optional kerbside green FOGO (Food Organics. Green Organics).

### In addition, households receive the following entitlements, each year:

Two At Home hard waste collections up to 3m<sup>3</sup> from within your property boundary. Bookings essential. Visit **melton.vic.gov.au/hardwaste OR** 

Two visits to the Melton Recycling Facility with a car or trailer up to 1m<sup>3</sup>.

#### OR

One visit to the Melton Recycling Facility and one At Home hard waste collection. Options expire on 30 June 2022. Terms and conditions apply. Visit **melton.vic.gov.au/waste** for more information.

The good news is, either property owners or renters can request a change to a property's bin options, with proof of residency. Additional bins, however, can only be requested by property owners, as fees apply.

#### Free green waste drop-off at Melton Recycling Facility until 31 December

Just in time for summer and the upcoming fire season, residents are able to drop off green waste for FREE at the Melton Recycling Facility, until 31 December.

Identification, and proof of residency, must be shown on

arrival, and operating hours for the MRF will be dependent on State Government COVID restrictions.
