Project Updates



Mount Atkinson Children's and Community Centre

The new Mount Atkinson Children's and Community Centre is almost complete and is expected to open in time for term one kindergarten next year.

The centre will provide flexible community space for a range of programs and services for the growing community, a Maternal Child Health Service and four-room kindergarten.

Three kindergarten rooms will initially open in January 2023 with the fourth to open as community demand grows.

This is a partnership project between Council and the Victorian Government through the Building Blocks grant program and the Growing Suburbs Fund.



The Diggers Rest Recreation Reserve project is progressing well, and groundwork has been done to prepare for the new community and sporting pavilion.

The project includes construction of a new sporting and community pavilion, realignment of Oval 2, and a new carpark and public toilets.

We're pleased to report that the earthworks are underway for the carpark, and the water tank is connected.

This is a partnership project between Council and the Victorian Government through the Growing Suburbs Fund, the Community Sports Infrastructure Stimulus Program and Community Cricket Program.

Fix Our Roads

We launched our Fix Our Roads campaign earlier this year calling on all political parties and candidates to commit to upgrading key roads across the City of Melton.

Serious congestion and safety issues plague City of Melton roads every single day. Years of underinvestment has led to aged, rural-standard, congested roads that are a huge safety concern.

Major works including additional lanes and upgraded interchanges are needed to support the movement of our booming population, grow jobs and maximise commercial productivity.

\$5.65 million for new community centres and playgrounds

We've secured \$5.65 million in new funding for community centres and playgrounds from the Victorian Government's *Growing Suburbs Fund*.

The projects successfully funded this round are new children's and community centres in Aintree, Plumpton and Weir Views, which will provide families and children with access to three and four-year-old funded kindergarten, additional maternal and child health and family and early childhood services, and new play equipment and shade at Barwon Street Reserve, Blackwood Drive Recreation Reserve and Hillside Recreation Park.

The *Growing Suburbs Fund* has delivered better community infrastructure for our rapidly growing community for nearly

a decade. Partnerships like these with the Victorian Government are vital for ensuring we continue to achieve positive outcomes for our community.



Growing and Thriving Strategy



Melton City Council recently endorsed a strategy that prioritises all abilities and all ages across the City of Melton.

Growing and Thriving is a four-year strategy that will strengthen our planning and service delivery for the whole community. It focuses on three key areas: feeling accepted and included; infrastructure and access, and; spaces, places and involvement.

It allows us to identify and bring together priorities for people living with disability, children, youth, older people and their carers, parents and guardians, and helps us understand what is needed for them to live their best lives.

The strategy will enable us to put an accessibility lens over our new and existing infrastructure and services and provide opportunities for participation for people of all abilities and all ages.

Make the most of your waste entitlements

Residents have the choice of a range of waste service options to suit their needs.

In addition, households receive the following entitlements, each year:

Two At Home hard waste collections up to 3m³ from within your property boundary. Bookings essential. Visit melton.vic.gov.au/hardwaste OR

Two visits to the Melton Recycling Facility with a car or trailer up to $1m^3$.

One visit to the Melton Recycling Facility and one At Home hard waste collection.

Options expire on 30 June 2023. Terms and conditions apply. Visit melton.vic.gov.au/waste for more information.

The good news is, either property owners or renters can request a change to a property's bin options, with proof of residency. Additional bins, however, can only be requested by property owners, as fees apply.

Free green waste drop-off at Melton **Recycling Facility until 31 December**


Just in time for summer and the upcoming fire season, residents are able to drop off green waste for FREE at the Melton Recycling Facility, from 1 November until 31 December.

Identification, and proof of residency, must be shown on arrival.


Always FREE to dispose for City of Melton residents. Charges apply for some items for non-residents:







Motor oil (max 6L container and up to 30L), Cooking oil (up to 25L)





Paint up to 100L, no larger than 20L and BBQ gas bottles (up to 9kg)



Steel or Solar Panels



Whitegoods such as fridges, washing machines and dryers (working or not)





Cardboard and paper
