

This information is provided by Gambling Information Resource Office (GIRO) and is based on 2012-2013 Victorian gaming machine data. The City of Melton is part of the North West Catchment, which also includes Brimbank, Hume and Maribyrnong municipalities or local government areas.

#### **OVERVIEW**

In 2012-2013, the North West Melbourne catchment had 2641 pokies in 46 gaming venues. It had a total net pokies expenditure of \$342,752,363.25 and \$780.84 per adult. There were 6.01 Pokies per 1000 adults and 9,542 adults per gaming venue.






#### POKIES LOSSES PER ADULT & NUMBER OF POKIES BY COUNCIL



This information is provided by Gambling Information Resource Office (GIRO) and is based on 2012-2013 Victorian gaming machine data. The City of Melton is part of the North West Catchment, which also includes Brimbank, Hume and Maribyrnong council areas.

#### **OVERVIEW**

In 2013-2014, the North West Melbourne catchment1 had 2577 pokies (EGMs) in 45 gaming venues. It had a total net pokie expenditure of \$347,481,860.11 and \$772.36 per adult. There were 5.7 Pokies per 1000 adults and 9,997 adults per gaming venue.






#### POKIES LOSSES PER ADULT & NUMBER OF POKIES BY COUNCIL



The City of Melton is part of the North West Catchment, which also includes Brimbank, Hume and Maribyrnong council areas.

#### **OVERVIEW**

- ► In 2014-15, the North West Melbourne catchment had 2646 electronic gaming machines (Pokies) in 45 gaming venues.
- ▶ It had a total net Pokie expenditure of \$356,896,513 and \$777 per adult.
- ► There were 5.76 Pokies per 1000 adults and 10,209 adults per venue.






#### POKIES LOSSES PER ADULT & NUMBER OF POKIES BY COUNCIL

#### **POKIES IN VICTORIA**

Welcome to the City of Melton's Responsible Gambling Awareness Week Fact Sheet Series. There are seven fact sheets in this series and this is Fact Sheet 5—Pokie in Victoria. This information was compiled by the Gambling Information Resource Office (GIRO).

#### How many pokies are there in Victoria?

▶ In total there are 28,892 licensed pokie machines in Victoria including:

► Crown Casino: 2.628

Gaming venues and hotels:

▶ In Melbourne: 18,638▶ In regional Victoria: 7,632

#### How many pokies venues are there in Victoria?

In total there are 506 pokies venues in Victoria divided between:

Clubs: 242Hotels: 264

## How much money is spent on pokies in Victoria and how much tax revenue is collected?

- According to the Victorian Commission for Gambling and Liquor Regulation, in 2014-2015:
  - ▶ \$2.572 billion was spent on pokies in clubs and hotels, and
  - ▶ \$961.3 million was collected in taxes.

#### **Problem Gamblers and Pokies in Victoria**

- The 2009 Victorian EPI study found 91 per cent of problem gamblers gambled using poker machines and 65 per cent listed pokies as the form of gambling they spent most money on.
- Crown casino has just over eight per cent of Victoria's pokies but 35 per cent of Victoria's problem gamblers who use pokies reported using them at Crown.
- Just over 56 per cent of the problem gamblers who played pokies reported doing so in clubs, while 52 per cent reported playing them in pubs.
- Just over one per cent of problem gamblers who played pokies reported they did so interstate.
- In July 2012 Victoria banned the presence of ATMs in pokies venues apart from the casino. An independent evaluation of the reform found 50 per cent of higher risk gamblers reported increased control over spending and decreased overspending as a result.
