Provide First Aid (HLTAID012) (12 to 25 years) | January

Nationally accredited course teaching fundamental principles, knowledge and skills to enable you to provide emergency care for injuries and illnesses, in the home or workplace. This is the standard workplace First Aid course, also referred to as Level 2.

Defensive Driving (17 to 25 years) | February

If you want to work in any bar, club, café, restaurant or venue (including liquor stores and bottleshops) that sells alcohol in Victoria, you will need a Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA) certificate. Receive a Victorian Commission for Liquor and Gambling Regulation (VCGLR) approved RSACertificate at completion of this course.
