# Pre-Immunisation Checklist



This checklist helps the nurse decide the best immunisation schedule for you or your child. Please tell the nurse if the person about to be immunised:

- is unwell on the day of immunisation
- has a disease which lowers immunity (such as leukaemia, cancer, HIV/AIDS, SCID) or is having treatment which lowers immunity (for example, oral steroid medicines such as cortisone and prednisone, radiotherapy, chemotherapy)
- has had a severe reaction following any vaccine
- has any severe allergies (to anything)
- has had any vaccine in the last month
- has had an injection of immunoglobulin, or received any blood products, or a whole blood transfusion within the past year
- is pregnant or planning a pregnancy or anticipating parenthood
- is a parent, grandparent or carer of a newborn
- has a past history of Guillain-Barré syndrome
- is a preterm baby born at less than 32 weeks gestation, or weighing less than 2000g at birth
- has a chronic illness
- has a bleeding disorder
- is a baby who has had intussusception, or a congenital abnormality that may predispose to intussusception
- does not have a functioning spleen
- lives with someone who has a disease which lowers immunity (such as leukaemia, cancer, HIV/AIDS), or lives with someone who is having treatment which lowers immunity (for example, oral steroid medicines such as cortisone and prednisone, radiotherapy, chemotherapy)
- identifies as an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander person
- is planning travel
- has an occupation or lifestyle factor/s for which vaccination may be needed.

**Before any immunisation takes place, the nurse will ask you:**

- Do you understand the information provided to you about the immunisation/s?
- Do you need more information to decide whether to proceed?
